

- Meaningfully engage indigenous, local and scientific knowledge holders in the co-creation of new evidence


In Kazakhstan, BES-Net* supported awareness-raising and training on sustainable land management, leading to an improvement in agricultural income for over 7,700 farmers and more than 300 new job creations

Bosnia and Herzegovina, Ethiopia and Nigeria joined the Coalition of the Willing on Pollinators and are developing national pollinator strategies



In Cameroon, the National Platform for Science-Policy Interface on BES plays a pivotal role in synthesizing the country's inputs to the draft post-2020 Global **Biodiversity Framework**

The **Viet Nam** NEA promoted inter-ministerial collaboration and the assessment findings have been used to inform the Law on Environmental Protection and the National Strategy on **Environmental Protection**
